- CCC Concurrent Functions Funding Proposals (iii)
  - The Clerk explained that the City Council is proposing to do away with Parish Concurrent Functions Funding. The most likely option is to phase it out over the next four years by reducing the payment each year to nil following 2024-25. They suggest that each year we precept the shortfall. For this year 2020-2021 the City Council's pot for CFF is £134,500.00 for 24 Parish Councils, currently we receive around £1700.00 annually towards the cost of maintaining the village green, the Nackington War Memorial area, the bus shelters and the village hall grounds. This payment represents around one and a quarter per cent of the City Council's total annual funding.
- (iv) Website – Accessibility
  - The meeting was advised that the Accessibility Statement is on our website on the home page. All that remains is to select a few of the photos currently on the site and add a text.
- (v)Coronavirus (COVID-19) – Update on any issues relating to Local Councils. Parish Councils are instructed to continue holding their meetings remotely and to make sure they are following the correct procedures for keeping the public informed that they are entitled to attend a remote meeting. Following discussion it was agreed that our agendas always give this information.

## 5. Planning Matters

- (i) CA/20/01585 8, Whitehill Close, Lower Hardres
  TPO np 4 1964 Fell Sycamore tree, located in the rear garden
  We were informed that this is a very tall tree located around 15ft away from the house, it
  has had some of its upper centre branches removed which may imply that it could be
  unstable. There was a little reluctance to a tree protected under a TPO to be felled but
  due to its age and the possibility of its instability it was agreed, provided there is a
  condition that it is replaced with a suitable native tree.
- (ii) CA/20/01392 Former Bygones Yard, Merton Lane, Lower Hardres Variation of conditions 1 (drawings), 2 (ancillary to main use), 5 (vehicle parking) and 7 (Premises use) of planning permission CA/17/01903/VAR for ancillary café use: to allow for alterations to the site layout, removal of name of site, amendments to parking, turning and access layout and sale of farm produce.

  It was considered these Variations to a previous application CA/17/01903 would result in altering it more or less to the recently refused application CA/19/10400 and would therefore raise the same objections and reasons for refusal. A response to the application to be written.
- (iii) CA/20/01558 Little Eaton Farm, Pett Bottom Road, Bridge Application for determination as to whether prior approval is required for the erection of an agricultural barn for storage. No comment
- (iv) The Clerk referred to the emailed planning document Landscape & Biodiversity which was circulated to members' last week. She asked for feedback on any concerns or issues members' may have.

#### 6. Planning Decisions by CCC

- (i) CA/20/01099 Wickham Hall, 4, Nackington Park, Nackington Road, Lower Hardres T.P.O. no 8 1991, T1 Ash, T2 Ash and T3 Sycamore Fell to ground level and remove stumps. Granted by CCC
- (ii) CA/20/01206 2, Highfield Cottages, Hardres Court Road, Lower Hardres Single-storey outbuilding following demolition of existing outbuilding. Granted by CCC
- (iii) CA/19/10400 Uniquely British Reclamation Yard, Merton Lane, Lower Hardres Change of use of main building from storage and sale of architectural salvage with ancillary café to farm shop with ancillary café together with erection of replacement side extension, stationing of additional 9 no. storage containers to rear of site for use as storage for farm shop and stationing of 2 no. additional containers for storage and sale of architectural salvage with continued use of existing 4 no. containers for that purpose. Refused by CCC
- (iv) CA/20/01187 Merton Manor, Stuppington Court Farm, Merton Lane, Lower Hardres Erection of 3 no bay car port. Granted by CCC
